Key Points of Revelation (Review):

Definition: To <u>reveal</u>, <u>disclose</u>, cause something to be <u>known</u>.

Title: Known from its Greek transliteration as the <u>Apocalypse</u>. -- Taken from Rev. 1:1 – "The revelation of Jesus Christ that God gave Him to show His slaves what must quickly take place."

Proper title: "The Revelation of Jesus Christ" (about Him & from Him).


Theme: The ultimate triumph of Jesus Christ Key Verse: 1:7

Inspired Outline: 1:19 – "Therefore write what you have seen [chap. 1 – theme: Christ], what is [chap. 2-3 – theme: Church], and what will take place after this [chap. 4-22 – theme: Consummation]."

Purpose: To give believers the advanced history of how Jesus Christ, through <u>judgment</u>, becomes <u>King</u>, with a view towards calling them to <u>faithfulness</u> and to <u>godliness</u>.

Three Series of 7 Judgments whereby Jesus becomes King: <u>Seal</u> Judgments (6); <u>Trumpet</u> Judgments (8-9); <u>Bowl</u> Judgments (16).

Two Key Patterns: (1) Alternating Perspectives between <u>Heaven</u> & <u>Earth;</u> (2) Alternate Pacing between <u>Action</u> & <u>Interlude</u>

Revelation 14:14-20

- I. The Grain Harvest: A Harvest of Redemption, vv. 14-16
 - A. The Reaper of the Harvest the Lord Himself, v. 14
 - **1. His Person "the Son of Man"** (cf. Revelation 14:8; Daniel 7:13; Matthew 8:20)
 - 2. His Position "with a <u>gold crown</u> on His head" This pictures the Son of Man coming to <u>conquer</u>.
 - 3. His Power "with a sharp sickle in His hand"
 When Jesus returns, He's coming to both gather His people into His barn as a farmer gathers his wheat; and He's coming to cut down the wicked like a farmer cuts down his wheat.
 - **B.** The <u>Ripeness</u> of the Harvest, v. 15 (cf. 2nd Peter 3:9; Mark 13:32; Matthew 13:26-30, 47-50)
 - C. The <u>Reaping</u> of the Harvest, v. 16 (cf. Matthew 24:31; 20:4; Revelation 6:9-11)
 This event is connected with the resurrection of the <u>tribulation martyrs</u> prior to the Millennial Kingdom.
