 - Knowledge the apprehension of truth in one's mind

III. Theme of Proverbs (1:7)

-- "The <u>fear</u> of the <u>Lord</u> is the beginning of knowledge." The fear of the Lord is a deep seated <u>reverence</u> for God that causes us to want to <u>please</u> Him at all costs.
