The First Trumpet

The Second Trumpet

⁸ The second angel blew his trumpet, and something like a great mountain ablaze with fire was hurled into the sea. So a third of the sea became blood, ⁹ a third of the living creatures in the sea died, and a third of the ships were destroyed.

The Third Trumpet

¹⁰ The third angel blew his trumpet, and a great star, blazing like a torch, fell from heaven. So, many of the people died from the waters, because they had been made bitter.

The Fourth Trumpet

Similar to the seventh plaque that came on (Exod. 9).

The Danger in Waiting (until the rapture/tribulation) to be Saved:

- (1) It's a <u>false</u> hope Scripture never encourages waiting until tomorrow (much less the tribulation period) to be saved.
- -- The chances of dying before then
- -- The conviction of the Holy Spirit may <u>diminish</u> with the passing of time, especially during the tribulation period (2 Thess. 2:11-12).
- (2) Those who are saved during the tribulation will experience great <u>persecution</u>, and very likely martyrdom.

Context of Revelation 8:6-13

- -- The world has already suffered through six <u>seal</u> judgments, comprising the <u>first</u> quarter (21 months) of the Tribulation period.
- -- The breaking of the <u>seventh</u> seal introduces the seven <u>trumpet</u> judgments, describing what conditions on earth will be like during the <u>second</u> quarter of the Tribulation period.
- -- The trumpet judgments are more <u>intense</u> and <u>severe</u> than the seal judgments. The seals will wipe out one-<u>fourth</u> of the world's population. The trumpets will decimate another <u>third</u> of it.

I. First Trumpet Judgment: <u>Vegetation</u> is <u>Burned</u> (7).

- -- Parallel to OT judgments on <u>Sodom</u> and <u>Gomorrah</u> (Gen. 18-19).
- -- Similar to the seventh plague that came on Egypt (Exod. 9).

Each aspect of the first trumpet judgment, hail, fire, and blood, represents certain spiritual concepts in the wrath of God.

- (1) "Hail" comes from <u>above</u> and naturally speaks of the source as well as the suddenness (cf. Isaiah 28:2).
- (2) "Fire" speaks of the consuming character of God's wrath.
- (3) "Blood" is naturally descriptive of death (Romans 6:23).

II. Second Trumpet Judgment: Sea Life & Ships Destroyed (8-9).

Three catastrophic, supernaturally designed effects result from the collision from an asteroid:

- (1) One-third of the sea becomes <u>blood</u>, reminiscent of the first plague sent upon <u>Egypt</u>, which turned the <u>Nile</u> River into blood (Exodus 7).
- (2) One-third of the creatures in the sea die.
- (3) Giant waves destroy a third of the ships on the world's oceans.

III. Third Trumpet Judgment: <u>Rivers</u> are <u>Poisoned</u> (10-11).

- -- A falling star (meteorite) fell from heaven on earth's <u>fresh</u> <u>water</u> sources, <u>killing</u> many people and <u>poisoning</u> a third of the world's fresh waters.
- -- Parallels the experience of the <u>Israelites</u> at the waters of Marah (Exodus 15:23-25).
- -- Important principle: Sin brings bitterness.

IV. Fourth Trumpet Judgment: Sun, Moon & Stars Darkened (12).

- -- An atmospheric phenomenon will cause the 24-hour period that constitutes a day to be <u>reduced</u> by one-third to <u>16</u> hours.
- -- Darkness is a common symbol of <u>judgment</u> in the OT, and the "<u>Day</u> of the <u>Lord</u>" was prophesied to be a time of darkness.
- -- Similar to the ninth plague upon <u>Egypt</u> (Ex. 10:21-23), which brought supernatural darkness to the Egyptians for <u>three</u> days.
- -- Fitting judgment for people who've rejected <u>Jesus</u> as the <u>true</u> Light; the light they had is now taken away.

V. The Proclamation of a Flying <u>Eagle</u> (13).

- -- The last three trumpet judgments the eagle announces are especially bad because they target <u>people</u>, rather than objects of nature.
- -- Benefits to understanding and heeding the prophetic future:
- 1. It brings perspective to what is important in life.
- 2. It serves as a <u>warning</u> to those who continue in sin.
- 3. It motivates us to share the truth with others.
- 4. It <u>assures</u> us of God's ultimate victory over sin and evil.
