THE CHURCH THAT MADE JESUS SICK Revelation 3:14-22

Some Christians have seen Christ's seven letters to seven churches as representing seven consecutive periods of church history.

To understand Christ's letter to the church at Laodicea, we first have to understand something about the <u>city</u>. The church in each case many times takes on <u>characteristics</u> of the city.

I. The <u>character</u> of <u>Jesus</u> is behind this message (14).

- A. Concerning the future, Jesus is "the Amen" (cf. 2 Cor. 1:20).
- B. He is "the <u>faithful</u> and <u>true</u> Witness" Jesus' <u>earthly</u> life.
- C. He is "the <u>Originator</u> of God's creation" looks back to Jesus' <u>eternal past</u> (cf. John 1:2-4; Col. 1:15-18; Heb. 1:2).

II. The <u>condition</u> of this church made the Lord <u>sick</u> (15-17); condemnation. Christ found two major faults in this church:

- A. They were <u>indifferent</u> to the work of <u>Christ</u>; they were spiritually "<u>lukewarm</u>" (15).
- B. They were <u>insensitive</u> to their <u>spiritual</u> need; they were spiritually <u>proud</u> (16-17).

III. The <u>counsel</u> of Jesus Christ must be <u>heeded</u> (18-19).

- A. They must recognize their spiritual need.
- B. They must realize why He rebukes and disciplines them.
- C. They must respond with repentance.

IV. The challenge of Jesus Christ to open the door (20).

V. The <u>consequences</u> for all <u>victors</u> (21-22).
