A Synopsis on:

The Spring Feasts of God April 12, 2020 Lesson

Introduction:

On the fourth day of creation, described in Genesis 1:14 – 19, God placed the sun and the moon and the stars in the heavens. He said He did this to separate the day from the night and to serve as signs to mark seasons and days and years. The Hebrew word for seasons here is mowadiym. That word can also mean appointed times or feasts. In that sense the feasts of God, as given to Israel officially on Mount Sinai with the law (Mosaic Covenant), are part of God's divine appointments. They are used in celebration as a way of remembrance to what God has done for His people. But we have also come to recognize they have a prophetic value. The feasts are God's appointed times to remember God's provision for Israel and their deliverance out of bondage in Egypt, making them His chosen people, redeeming them so they will know Him as the LORD their God, promising to bring them to the Promised Land (Exodus 6:2-8). God's provision for Israel was literally fulfilled for Israel in the Spring Feasts by the Messiah in Jesus' death, burial, resurrection and sending the Holy Spirit to live in His people, all part of His first coming. But we wait for the Fall Feasts yet to be literally fulfilled in His second coming.

Hebrew Calendar Dates for the Spring Feasts:

Passover – 14th day of first month (Abib or Nisan)

Unleavened Bread – 15th through 21st day of first month (Abib or Nisan)

First Fruits – Day after the Sabbath in Unleavened Bread in the first month (Abib or Nisan)

Weeks – 6th day of third month (Sivan) – 50 days from First Fruits

What is remembered in the Spring Feasts:

Passover – God's deliverance from death for the firstborn children of Israel in the 10th plague when the Egyptian children were killed by the angel of death as Israel covered their door frames with the blood of the lamb.

Unleavened Bread – God's provision in delivering Israel out of bondage in Egypt on that night they had to leave quickly so the bread was made without yeast.

First Fruits – God's promise to complete the harvest of the grain (barley crop) when Israel dedicated the first fruits of the harvest to God.

Weeks – Celebration honoring God for the completion of the spring grain harvest (wheat crop) as summer nears.
