Genesis 2020 Chapter Nine

Chapter 9:1 And God blessed Noah and his sons and said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth. 2 The fear of you and the dread of you shall be upon every beast of the earth and upon every bird of the heavens, upon everything that creeps on the ground and all the fish of the sea. Into your hand they are delivered.

Noah is now a type of a Second Adam. The blessing to multiply and fill the earth and subdue it is parallel to Genesis 1:28 "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it, and have dominion over

the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth." ... Two caveats: 1. The dread of the beasts indicates that in the beginning of creation there was no fear... there was nothing or no-one to fear. This changed, for 2. the beasts have been given a fear of man by the decree of God.

There is a 3rd caveat, possibly the reason for the 2nd: v.3a Every moving thing that lives shall be food for you.

Several new themes will take place through and after the flood narrative, one of them is meat for food. Notice:

the meat sacrifices of which Adam and his sons undoubtedly took part were not consumed by them. So the theme of blood sacrifice, without eating the blood is introduced here.

9:3b And as I gave you the green plants, I give you everything. 4 But you shall not eat flesh with its life, that is, its blood. 5 And for your lifeblood I will require a reckoning: from every beast I will require it and from man. From his fellow man I will require a

reckoning for the life of man.

6 "Whoever sheds the blood of man, by man shall his blood be shed,

for God made man in his own image. *Emphasis is on the blood:*

⇒ Genesis 4:10 And the LORD said, "What have you done? The voice of your brother's blood is crying to me from the ground.

> Leviticus 17:10 If anyone from the house of Israel or a foreigner living among them eats any blood, I will set My face against that person and cut him off from among his people.

11 For the life of the flesh is in the blood, and I have given it to you to make atonement for your souls upon

the altar; for it is the blood that makes atonement for the soul. 12 Therefore I say to the Israelites, '

None of you may eat blood, nor may any foreigner living among you eat blood.'...

→ Hebrews 9:22 According to the law, in fact,

nearly everything must be purified with blood, and without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness. > Hebrews 12:23 You have come to God the Judge of all, to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, 24 to

Jesus the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel.

Thus, it would behoove us to take into consideration the seriousness of *'being naked*.' I refer folks back to notes on nakedness in **chapters 2-3**.

In pronouncing the oracle, Noah discerned the traits of his sons and, in a moment of insight, determined that the attributes of their descendants were embodied in his sons' personalities. Because these sons were primogenitors of the families of the earth, the narrator is more interested in the greater meaning of the oracle with respect to tribes and nations in his day than with the children of Shem, Ham, and Japheth. On the basis of their actions, they would either share in the blessing or be cursed. Within the general oracle of Noah there seems to be an emphasis on the Canaanites, who are the antagonists in the Book of Genesis. What else would Israel think of when they read that Canaan had been cursed in antiquity? Allen P. Ross..

Finally; the act of covering their father's nakedness reveals a certain kindness not taken before in Genesis and illustrates as act taken by God Himself in **Genesis 3:21**.

...Revelation 3:18 I counsel you to buy from me gold refined by fire, so that you may be rich, and white garments so that you may clothe yourself and the shame of your nakedness may not be seen.

<u>New Treasures of Thread</u>: Covenants; Blessing and Cursing; Ham's act antithesis of honoring his father; Ham caused a breach in his family, his own descendants would be cursed; Drunkenness; Nakedness, Moral abandonment; and Giants and the unredeemable.





However, in Hebrew when a masculine singular definite attributive adjective follows the sequence masculine singular construct noun plus proper name, the adjective invariably modifies the noun in construct, not the proper name. 

Now...concerning the one who willed to annul God's government and plans: Gen 10:9a Cush fathered Nimrod; Name means literally "he turned himself against", or resultative "to be rebellious" ... "Rebel."

Gen 10:9b he was the first on earth to be a mighty man. 9 He was a mighty hunter before the Lord. Therefore it is said, "Like Nimrod a mighty hunter before the Lord."

To understand "Mighty Man" we again let Scripture interpret Scripture. <u>A</u>. Used regarding a warrior: $\dots 2$ Sam 23:16 mighty men broke through the camp of the Philistines.

...but more is involved. Nimrod's warrior infamy resounded on the earth (first on earth).

B. The term "mighty hunter" often times corresponded to 'hunting men.' Genesis 10:9 tn The Hebrew word for "hunt" is "tsayid", which is used on occasion for hunting men. **→ 1 Sam 24:12** Saul hunted David's life.

→ Jer 16:16 "Behold, I am sending for many fishers, declares the LORD, and they shall catch them. And afterward I will send for many hunters, and they shall hunt them from every mountain and every hill, and out of the clefts of the rocks.

Lam 3:52 "I have been hunted like a bird by those who were my enemies without cause.

<u>C</u>. The term "before the Lord" is literally translated "*before the face of the Lord*."

... it is used both positively and negatively; context determines its use. Compare:

a. Lev 23:20 The priest shall wave them with the bread of the firstfruits as a wave offering before the LORD.
b. Num 3:4 Nadab and Abihu died before the LORD when they offered unauthorized fire before the LORD.

Therefore, the context of Nimrod's actions stipulate whether he was for God, or "in the face of God." → He built city after city (eight).

... in doing so, (building cities) he established the

first "kingdom" on earth (worldly kingdom).

➤ He 'raised' two areas historically renowned for their animosity and hatred for both God and Israel.

- ... from these areas come both cult religions and anti
 - god governments; Shinar (Babylon) and Assyria.

➤ Therefore, in using terms such as "he began to be a mighty man" and "the beginning of his kingdoms," God is explaining that he was the first dictator, slave owner, tyrant, and autocrat.

...he is the preeminent anti-god and for-runner of the anti-christ who is ultimately to come. Following is a clear and profound case, in two parts, that provide a clear thread that both Assyria and Babylon play out to the end of time, and that the Assyrian is the man of sin.

First notice the hunter who hunted: **Jer 50:17** "*Israel is a hunted sheep driven away by lions. First the king of Assyria devoured him, and now at last Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon has gnawed his bones.*" We also find that while it seems both nation and ruler have their own will and program, it is always within the full plan of God as He brings justice to the earth.

Case Number Two: The Book of Isaiah
 prophesies the rise of Babylon and its cultic
 dominion, and Jeremiah establishes the case
 that Babylon is the seat of Satan, the dragon.
 All cultic religions hail from Babylon and will end

there. And Babylon, along with its religion, will rise again, in culmination with the Assyrian, the antichrist.

⇒ Isaiah 14:22 "I will rise up against them," declares the Lord of hosts, "and will cut off from Babylon name and remnant, descendants and posterity.

...therefore, the preceding verses in chapter 14 set a case against Babylon, and notice the spiritual context and Satan in particular here:

11 Your pomp is brought down to Sheol, the sound of your harps; maggots are laid as a bed beneath you, and worms are your covers. 12 "How you are fallen from heaven, O Day Star, son of Dawn! How you are cut down to the ground, you who laid the nations low! 13 You said in your heart, *Twill ascend to heaven:* above the stars of God I will set my throne on high; I will sit on the mount of assembly in the far reaches of the north; 14 I will ascend above the heights of the clouds; I will make myself like the Most High.' 15 But you are brought down to Sheol,

to the far reaches of the pit.

⇒ Compare Jeremiah 50:1 The word that the Lord spoke concerning Babylon, concerning the land of the Chaldeans, by Jeremiah the prophet:

2 "Declare among the nations and proclaim, set up a banner and proclaim, conceal it not, and say: 'Babylon is taken, Bel is put to shame, Merodach (Marduk) is dismayed. Her images are put to shame, her idols are dismayed.'

And Notice what happens to the 'first of the nations' ... Jeremiah 50:12 "Behold, she shall be the last of the nations, a wilderness, a dry land, and a desert."

Jeremiah 51:25 "Behold, I am against you, O destroying mountain, you who devastate the whole earth, declares the LORD. I will stretch out My hand against you; I will roll you over the cliffs and turn you into a charred mountain... 34 "Nebuchadnezzar the king of Babylon has devoured me; he has crushed me; he has made me an empty vessel; he has swallowed me like a monster; he has filled his stomach with my delicacies; he has rinsed me out. 35 The violence done to me and to my kinsmen be upon Babylon," let the inhabitant of Zion say. "My blood be upon the inhabitants of Chaldea," let Jerusalem say. 36 Therefore this is what the LORD says: "Behold, I will plead your case and take vengeance on your behalf; I will dry up her sea and make her springs run dry. 37 Babylon will become a heap of rubble, a haunt for jackals, an object of horror and scorn, without inhabitant.

Rev 18:2 And he cried out in a mighty voice: "Fallen, fallen is Babylon the great! She has become a dwelling place for demons, a haunt for every unclean spirit, a haunt for every unclean bird, a haunt for every unclean and detestable beast.
3 For all nations have drunk the wine of the passion of her sexual immorality, and the kings of the earth have committed immorality with her, and the merchants of the earth have grown rich from the power of her luxurious living." ... "Alas, alas, for the great city that was clothed in fine linen, in purple and scarlet, adorned with gold, with jewels, and with pearls!

17 For in a single hour all this wealth has been laid waste." ...24 And in her was found the blood of prophets and of saints, and of all who have been slain on earth."

NOW....Babylon has never fallen. It seems dead!

FROM MEI@75 Babylon has seen it all. From its peak as the Neo-Babylonian capital under King Nebuchadnezzar through its heavy-handed 1987 reconstruction by Saddam Hussein to its post-invasion demise when American and Polish

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troops ran roughshod over its ruins and ISIS threatened its very existence, the ancient city has witnessed empires come and go.

The 2500-acre site, 50 miles south of Baghdad, comprises both the ruins of the ancient city as well as surrounding villages and agricultural areas. It was here that King Hammurabi (1792-1750 BCE) produced the world's first written law....These are the laws of justice which Hammurabi the able king has established.... That the strong may not oppress the weak, to give justice to the orphan and widow, I have inscribed my precious words on my stele and established it in Babylon before my statue called the 'King of Justice.' From 626 to 539 BCE, the city was the capital of the Neo-Babylonian empire and the largest metropolis in the world. Sacked by the Hittites in 1595 BCE, and conquered by the Kassites in 1570 BCE, it became a center for worship of the god Marduk for four centuries. After the Assyrian King Esarhaddon rebuilt the holy city, amid fear of divine retribution, Babylonians regained control in 612 BCE.

FROM Odyssey; Adventures In Archaeology:

We know of at least 32 ziggurats in Mesopotamia and western Iran and typically they are built out of a core of mud-brick with an outer skin of fired bricks, set in bitumen mortar, to protect it against flood damage. In later times, according to Herodotus, the outer skin was glazed and the various tiers were painted with different colors. Herodotus also tells us that there was a temple at the top of the ziggurat at Babylon, but no trace of any such building has been found at Babylon nor anywhere else (not surprising, really, when you consider that none of them has survived to its full height)...Records were kept (monthly, quarterly and annually) of the amount of woolen thread issued and the amount of cloth produced according to quality and weight—they even made allowance for wastage. Rations were issued according to skill and outputgenerally the older and younger women received less.

Will Babylon Rise Again?

A Side Bar: About Daniel and Nebuchadnezzar:

→ Nebuchadnezzar is the most violent king that ever reigned on the planet. He is the only one mentioned in the Scriptures, besides God, as being king of the whole world. He is the "Head of Gold" which sets the stage for the history of nations to be destroyed, in totality by Christ.

- ⇒ Daniel is a type of Israel as is Noah; his name means "God is my Judge."
- > Daniel and three others are the focus; taken hostage in the third year of the reign of Jehoiakim.
- ... Jehoiakim means "God rises up."
- \Rightarrow The fiery furnace illustrates the tribulation.

 \Rightarrow While three of the four hostages go through the

fiery furnace, the fourth member (Daniel) is no-where to be seen (where is he?).

>> Nebuchadnezzar is ultimately made to crawl and eat like an animal, and finally, to look up from his

lowered state and proclaim that God is

"The Most High God

How great are his signs,

how mighty his wonders!

His kingdom is an everlasting kingdom, _____

and his dominion endures from generation to generation.

→ Nebuchadnezzar was "driven from among men."

Now...a little about the "second Nimrod" ...and not too dissimilar from Nebuchadnezzar.

> Daniel 8:24 His power will be great, but it will not be his own. He will cause terrible destruction and succeed in whatever he does. He will destroy the mighty men along with the holy people. 25 Through his craft and by his hand, he will cause deceit to prosper, and in his own mind he will make himself great. In a time of peace he will destroy many, and he will even stand against the Prince of princes.

→ Daniel 11:16 The invader will do as he pleases; no one will stand against him. He will establish himself in the Beautiful Land, with destruction in his hand.

22 When Serug had lived 30 years, he fathered Nahor. 23 And Serug lived after he fathered Nahor 200 years and had other sons and daughters.

24 When Nahor had lived 29 years, he fathered Terah. 25 And Nahor lived after he fathered Terah 119 years and had other sons and daughters.

26 When Terah had lived 70 years, he fathered Abram, Nahor, and Haran.

27 Now these are the generations of Terah. Terah fathered Abram, Nahor, and Haran; and Haran fathered Lot. 28 Haran died in the presence of his father Terah in the land of his kindred, in Ur of the

Chaldeans. **29** And Abram and Nahor took wives. The name of Abram's wife was Sarai, and the name of Nahor's wife, Milcah, the daughter of Haran the father of Milcah and Iscah. **30** Now Sarai was barren; she had no child.

31 Terah took Abram his son and Lot the son of Haran, his grandson, and Sarai his daughter-in-law, his son Abram's wife, and they went forth together from Ur of the Chaldeans to go into the land of Canaan, but when they came to Haran, they settled there. **32** The days of Terah were 205 years, and Terah died in Haran.

In Genesis chapter 9 and 10 we did some meaning of names and the possibility of God's message to mankind. There may be a similar message in Genesis 11 so I have provided the names for you use, but haven't taken the time to track down a possible message as before.

GENESIS 11 Meaning of Names

- Shem The name - Arpachshad Boundary Of The Chaldeans ... He Gathers Mascara Like A Demon - Shelah Sent Out, Branch or Javelin / ... Prosperity or Booty. Missionary, Emissary

- Eber The Region Beyond, One From Beyond, ... He Who Passed Over

- Peleg Division, Dividing Canal - Reu Friend, Associate - Serug Branch

- Nahor Snort, Scorched, Freeman - Terah Delay, Wanderer, Global Spirit

- Abram Father - Abraham Father of Many - Nahor Snort, Scorched, Freeman

- Haran Mountainous, Mountaineer - Lot Covering - Sarai My Princess

- Sarah Royal Princess

In the canonical scriptures, the writer does not expound upon Abraham's birth and childhood; it is simply stated: "Terah fathered Abram."

- Extra biblical text of Jasher (Yasher 8).

- On the night of Abram's birth all the servants of Terah and all the wise men of Nimrod and his conjurors came and ate and drank with Terah.

- That night they looked at the stars and saw a sign and took it that Abram would be great.

- Nimrod finds out and wants to kill the child.

- Terah hides Abram in a cave for 10 years.

- 10 yrs old Abram moves in with Noah.

- Noah teaches Abram about God.

- All the sons of the earth in those days rebelled against God and served other elohim.

- Terah with all his household were the first of those that served gods of wood and stone.

- Terah had twelve gods of large size, made of wood and stone, after the twelve months of the year. He served each one monthly bringing meat and drink offerings to his gods.

- Abram would come home and prove these gods neither ate nor drank and argued with his father.

- Nimrod kept a tight reign on his subjects and all the earth was under his control; it was of one tongue.

- All the princes of Nimrod and his great men took counsel together; Phut, Mitzraim, Cush and Canaan with their families and said "Come let us" build ourselves a city and in it a strong tower, and its top reaching heaven, and we will make ourselves famed, so that we may reign upon the whole world, in order that the evil of our enemies may cease from us, that we may reign mightily over them, and that we may not become scattered over the earth by war.

- The families consisted of 600,000 men.

- They sought the whole earth and found none like one valley east of the land of Shinar, about two days' walk; they journeyed and they dwelt there.

- The families divided themselves in three parts; the first said We will ascend into heaven and fight against God; the second said, We will ascend to heaven and place our own gods there and serve them; and the third part said, We will ascend to heaven and smite him with bows and spears; and God knew all their works and all their evil thoughts.

They built themselves a great city and very high and strong tower; its height precluded the mortar and bricks reaching the builders in their ascent to it, until those who went up had completed a full year.
Men ascended and descended the whole day; and if a brick should fall from their hands and get broken, they would all weep over it, and if a man fell and died, none of them would look at him.

- God said to the seventy angels who stood foremost before him "Come let us descend and confuse their tongues, that one man shall not understand the language of his neighbor," and they did so.

-Nimrod dwelt in Babel, and he there renewed his reign over the subjects and princes who called his name Amraphel, saying that at the tower his princes and men fell through his means.

- Amraphel means "One That Darkens Counsel" or "Speaks of Dark Things." -Mardon was his son, and worse than his father.

— A primary Babylonian god is Marduk, meaning "immortal son of Utu' or 'bull calf of the sun god Utu.' The origin of Marduk's name may reflect an earlier genealogy, or have had cultural ties." In other words, this primary god may have been named by Nimrod on behalf of his 'son' and the 'bull calf sun god.' Meaning, Nimrod either called himself Utu, or more likely gave his son to Utu "the ancient Mesopotamian sun god, god of justice, morality, and truth, and the twin of the Mesopotamian goddess Inanna (Ishtar in the Assyria-Babylonian language), the Queen of Heaven. — Ishtar, (also known as Semiramis, widow of Nimrod, is the mother of Tammuz) who came to be represented as the bare breasted pagan fertility goddess of the east.

Josephus wrote: Now it was Nimrod who excited them to such an affront and contempt of God. He persuaded them not to ascribe it to God, as if it were through his means they were happy, but to believe that it was their own courage which procured that happiness. He also gradually changed the government into tyranny, seeing no other way of turning men from the fear of God, but to bring them into a constant dependence on his power. He also said he would be revenged on God, if he should have a mind to drown the world again; for that he would build a tower too high for the waters to reach. And that he would avenge himself on God for destroying their forefathers. Now the multitude were very ready to follow Nimrod, and to esteem it a piece of cowardice to submit to God; and they built a tower, neither sparing any pains and by reason of the multitude of hands employed in it, it grew very high, sooner than any one could expect...It was built of burnt brick, cemented together with mortar, made of bitumen, that it might not be liable to admit water. The place wherein they built the tower is now called Babylon, because of the confusion of that language which they readily understood before; for the Hebrews mean by the word Babel, confusion ...

And when this is prepared, they will set the basket down there on its base."

CHAPTERS 1 - 11 ARE FOUNDATIONAL

Some like to say there were three particular rebellions, but an overall view of chapters 1-11 reveal a two divine conspiracies carried out in stages. All of this sets up Gen 12 and the rest of Scripture, and culminates in Jesus Christ, the Warrior King, returning order to HIs Creation.

...In chapter 12, we will need to immediately begin to track these ideas going forward. The underlying spiritual warfare is actually very illustrative once we understand Genesis 1-11.
