**Israelites in Egypt before the Law is Given – Exodus 1:1 – 18:27**

- \* Original descendants of Jacob (70) – Exodus 1:1–5
- \* After Joseph and his brothers died the Israelites multiplied greatly – Exodus 1:6–7
- \* A new king of Egypt oppressed the Israelites and killed the Israelite boys – Exodus 1:8–22
- \* At this time, Moses was born in Egypt to a Levite woman – Exodus 2:1–2
- \* Moses was hidden and saved in a basket in the Nile River – Exodus 2:3–9
- \* He became the son of Pharaoh’s daughter, raised as an Egyptian – Exodus 2:10
- \* For his first 40 years, Moses lived as an Egyptian – Acts 7:23
- \* But he killed an Egyptian who was beating a Hebrew – Exodus 2:11–12
- \* He was exposed and rejected by his own and had to flee to Midian – Exodus 2:13–20
- \* Moses married Zipporah, the daughter of Reuel – Exodus 2:21
- \* Moses had a son named Gershom with Zipporah – Exodus 2:22
- \* The king of Egypt dies – Exodus 2:23
- \* Israel groans in slavery and God hears their cry – Exodus 2:23–25
- \* For the next 40 years, Moses lived in Midian as a shepherd – Acts 7:30 –
  - At 80 years old, God called Moses at the burning bush on Mount Horeb, the mountain of God – Exodus 3:1 & Acts 7:30:
  - The angel of the LORD appeared to him in flames of fire from within the bush and God called Moses by name and Moses answered – Exodus 3:2,4
  - God said, “I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, God of Isaac and the God of Jacob.” – Exodus 3:6
  - The LORD said, “I have indeed seen the misery of My people in Egypt. I have heard them crying out.” – Exodus 3:7
  - He said He had come to rescue Israel – Exodus 3:8
  - God told Moses His name – Exodus 3:14–15

- \*Moses and Aaron go to Pharaoh – Exodus 5 & 6
- \*Ten plagues – Exodus 7:14–11:10
- \*Passover initiated – Exodus 12:1–30
- \*Crossing the Red Sea – Exodus 13:17–14:31
- \*Song of Moses – Exodus 15:1–18
- \*God provides food and water – Exodus 16:1–17:7
- \*Amalekites defeated – Exodus 17:8–16
- \*Jethro visits Moses – Exodus 18:1–27

#### **The Law is Given – Exodus 19:1 - 20:21**

- \*The arrival in front of the mountain in the desert of Sinai – Exodus 19:1–2
  - About a 50 day journey from Egypt – Exodus 19:1–2
- \* Moses made his first trip up the mountain to be with God and receive His instructions – Exodus 19:3–6
  - Tell the people of Israel that they have seen what He did to Egypt, and how He carried them on eagles wings and brought them to Himself – Exodus 19:4
  - Now if you obey Me fully and keep My covenant, then out of all nations you will be My treasured possession – Exodus 19:5a
  - Although the whole earth is Mine, you will be for Me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation – Exodus 19:5b–6a
  - These are the words you are to speak to the Israelites – Exodus 19:6b
- \* Moses went back down and set before the people what God had commanded – Exodus 19:7
- \* The people responded, “We will do everything the LORD has said.” And Moses went back up and brought their answer to the LORD – Exodus 19:8
- \* The LORD said to Moses, “I am going to come to you in a dense cloud. Go to the people and consecrate them today and tomorrow and be ready by the third day because the LORD will come down on Mount Sinai in the sight of the people. – Exodus 19:9–11
- \* Do not go up the mountain or touch the foot of it. Only when the ram’s horn sounds a long blast may they go up to the mountain – Exodus 19:12–13
- \* Moses went back down the mountain and consecrated the people, who were to abstain from sexual relations – Exodus 19:14–15
- \* On the morning of the third day there was thunder and lightning with a thick cloud over the mountain and a very loud trumpet blast – Exodus 19:16
- \* Moses led the people to meet with God at the foot of the mountain, which was covered with smoke – Exodus 19:17–18
- \* The trumpet sound grew louder. Then Moses spoke and God answered – Exodus 19:19
- \* The LORD descended to the top of Mount Sinai and called Moses up, so he went up – Exodus 19:20
- \* The LORD told Moses to go down and warn the people to not come up for the mountain is to be set apart as holy – Exodus 19:21–23
- \* The LORD replied to bring Aaron up with him but not the priests or people. So Moses went down to the people – Exodus 19:24–25
