

- * God spoke all these words: “I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery.” – Exodus 20:1–2
- * The Ten Commandments – Exodus 20:3–17 –
 - “You shall have no other gods before Me.” – Exodus 20:3
 - “You shall not make for yourself an idol...You shall not bow down to them or worship them.” – Exodus 20:4–6
 - “You shall not misuse the name of the LORD your God.” – Exodus 20:7
 - “Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.” – Exodus 20:8–11
 - “Honor your father and your mother.” – Exodus 20:12
 - “You shall not murder.” – Exodus 20:13
 - “You shall not commit adultery.” – Exodus 20:14
 - “You shall not steal.” – Exodus 20:15
 - “You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.” – Exodus 20:16
 - “You shall not covet.” – Exodus 20:17
- * When the people saw the thunder and lightning and heard the trumpet and saw the mountain in smoke, they trembled with fear, not wanting God to speak to them or they will die. – Exodus 20:18–19
- * Moses said, “Do not be afraid. God has come to test you, so that the fear of God will be with you to keep you from sinning.” – Exodus 20:20
- * The people remained at a distance, while Moses approached the thick darkness where God was. – Exodus 20:21

The Rest of the Time at the Mountain – Exodus 20:22 – Numbers 10:10

- * More instructions given to Moses on the Mountain – Exodus 20:22–31:18 –
 - About idols and altars; Hebrew servants; personal injury; property protection; social responsibility – Exodus 20:22 – 22:31
 - About justice and mercy; Sabbath laws and annual feasts – Exodus 23:1–19
 - About God’s angel to prepare the way to drive out Israel’s enemies – Exodus 23:20–33
 - Covenant confirmation resumed from Exodus 20:21, with Exodus 24:1–18
 - Tabernacle detailed instructions to Moses from the LORD – Exodus 25:1–31:11
 - Meaning of the Sabbath and the giving of the tablets of stone – Exodus 31:12–18
- * Moses was up on the mountain 40 days and 40 nights – Exodus 32:1–35 –
 - The people grumbled and Aaron helped them make the golden calf – Exodus 32:1–6
 - The LORD told Moses that he better go down there because of the corruption – Exodus 32:7–10
 - Moses sought the LORD’s favor to not destroy His people and the LORD relented – Exodus 32:11–14
 - The Moses went down with the tablets of stone and he was so angry with what he witnessed, he threw the tablets and broke them – Exodus 32:15–19
 - Moses burned the broken calf into powder and made the Israelites drink it – Exodus 32:20
 - Aaron made excuses – Exodus 32:21–25

- Moses commanded the Levites to kill the rebellious people and 3000 died – Exodus 32:26–28
- Moses blessed the Levites then sought forgiveness, but the LORD struck the people with a plague – Exodus 32:29–35
- * Moses made another trip up the mountain to get the new tablets – Exodus 33:1–34:5
 - God called His people stiff-necked and the people mourned and took off their ornaments at Mt. Horeb – Exodus 33:1–6
 - Moses said, “Show me Your glory” and the LORD showed him His back but not His face – Exodus 33:7–23
 - Then Moses chiseled out two stone tablets and went back up the mountain – Exodus 34:1–4
- * The LORD came down in the cloud and passed in front of Moses, making a covenant with Moses – Exodus 34:5–28
- * When Moses came down from the mountain, the glory of God was on his face and he had to put a veil over his face – Exodus 34:29–35
- * Israel followed the instructions of Moses to assemble the tabernacle and when completed, the glory of the LORD filled the tabernacle – Exodus 35:1–40:38
- * The book of Leviticus provides a detailed set of regulations for Israel’s holy living and worship – Leviticus 1:1–27:34 –
 - Regulations concerning offering sacrifices – Leviticus 1:1–7:38
 - Regulations and consequences for the priesthood – Leviticus 1:1–7:38
 - Regulations concerning purity of food, after childbirth, against disease, contamination and discharges – Leviticus 11:1–15:33
 - Regulations for the Day of Atonement – Leviticus 16:1– 34
 - Regulations for holy living – Leviticus 17:1–22:33
 - Regulations concerning the Sabbath Day, the Feasts of God, the Sabbath Year and the Year of Jubilee – Leviticus 23:1–25:55
 - Reward for obedience, punishment for disobedience – Leviticus 26:1–46
 - Regulations for offerings vowed to the LORD – Leviticus 27:1–34
- * The book of Numbers completes the nearly one year stay at the mountain – Numbers 1:1–10:10 –
 - The LORD commanded a census of the Israelite community – Numbers 1:1- 4:49
 - The LORD commanded purity of the people – Numbers 5:1–10:10 –
 - The test for purity in the law of jealousy – Numbers 5:1–31
 - The Nazirite vow and the priestly blessing – Numbers 6:1–27
