

The Wilderness Journey – Numbers 10:11 – Deuteronomy 34:12

***From the Desert of Sinai to the Desert of Paran – Numbers 10:11–12:16**

- The Israelites leave the Mountain of the LORD – Numbers 10:11–36
- The complaining Israelites – Numbers 11:1–35:
 - The LORD sent fire at Taberah, Moses prayed, the fire died down – Numbers 11:1–3
 - The Israelites craved other food than manna so the LORD brought quail – Numbers 11:4–35
- Sibling rivalry – Numbers 12:1–16:
 - Miriam and Aaron opposed Moses – Numbers 12:1–2
 - The LORD burned with anger, Miriam was struck with leprosy and Aaron intervened on her behalf, so Moses cried out to the LORD and He answered – Numbers 12:3–16

***At Kadesh in Paran, the Israelites' journey delayed by their rebellion – Numbers 13:1–20:13**

- Moses sent twelve spies into Canaan – Numbers 13:1–14:45:
 - Only two spies returned with a good report – Numbers 13:30, 14:6–9
 - The other ten were struck down and died of a plague – Numbers 14:37
- Reminders to the Israelites – Numbers 15:1–41
- Never forget Korah's rebellion – Numbers 16:1–50
- Aaron's staff budded and his role as high priest – Numbers 17:1–18:32
- The killing of the red heifer – Numbers 19:1–22
- Miriam died at Kadesh and while there water from the rock provided – Numbers 20:1–13

*** From Kadesh to the plains of Moab – Numbers 20:14–22:1**

- Edom refused Israel passage – Numbers 20:14–21
- Death of Aaron – Numbers 20:22–29
- Israel victory against the Canaanites – Numbers 21:1–3
- Look upon the bronze snake – Numbers 21:4–9
- Israel's journey toward Moab – Numbers 21:10–22:1

***On the plains of Moab, anticipating taking the Promised Land – Numbers 22:2–32:42**

- Balak using Balaam to curse Israel – Numbers 22:2–24:25:
 - Balak, king of Moab, feared Israel and sought pagan divination using Balaam to curse them – Numbers 22:2–8
 - Balaam confronted by the angel of the LORD unable to curse Israel – Numbers 22:9–41
 - Balaam's four oracles plus a final one – Numbers 23:1–24:25
- Moab seduces Israel – Numbers 25:1–18
- Second census taken – Numbers 26:1–65
- Inheritance rules and Joshua commissioned to replace Moses – Numbers 27:1–23
- Offerings and feast days – Numbers 28:1–29:40
- Importance of vows – Numbers 30:1–16
- Vengeance on the Midianites – Numbers 31:1–54
- Following the Transjordan tribes – Numbers 32:1–42

- * **Dealing with various matters – Numbers 33:1–36:13**
 - Stages of Israel’s journey from Egypt to Moab – Numbers 33:1–56
 - Boundaries and assignment of land in the Promised Land – Numbers 34:1–29
 - Levite towns and cities of refuge – Numbers 35:1–34
 - Inheritance of Zelophehad’s daughters – Numbers 36:1–13
- * **Moses’ first address – Preamble and historical prologue – Deuteronomy 1:1–4:43**
 - These are the words Moses spoke 30 days before the completion of 40 years, in review of Israel’s wandering:
 - Command to leave Horeb and appoint leaders– Deuteronomy 1:6–18
 - Spies sent out followed by rebellion against the LORD – Deuteronomy 1:19–46
 - Followed by wanderings in the desert for nearly 40 years – Deuteronomy 2:1–3:29
 - Obedience commanded and idolatry forbidden – Deuteronomy 4:1–31
 - The LORD is God and cities of refuge – Deuteronomy 4:32–43
- * **Moses’ second address – A restatement of God’s laws, lessons in righteous living and blessings and curses – Deuteronomy 4:44–28:68**
 - Introduction to the law and the Ten Commandments – Deuteronomy 4:44–5:33
 - Love the LORD your God (The Shema) – Deuteronomy 6:1–25
 - God has chosen Israel to be His people, His treasured possession – Deuteronomy 7:1–26
 - Do not forget the LORD – Deuteronomy 8:1–20
 - It is not for Israel’s righteousness that God is giving them the land – Deuteronomy 9:1–29
 - You have the two tablets of stone in the ark, so fear the LORD and love and obey Him – Deuteronomy 10:1–11:32
 - Follow the practical lessons in righteous living – Deuteronomy 12:1–27:26
 - Blessings for obedience, curses for disobedience – Deuteronomy 28:1–68
- * **Moses’ third address – renewal, order, song and tribal blessing – Deuteronomy 29:1–33:29**
 - Renewal of the covenant – Deuteronomy 29:1–29
 - The LORD will gather them from the nations where He scattered – Deuteronomy 30:1–10
 - Choose life – Deuteronomy 30:11–20
 - Joshua to succeed Moses and Moses recited the words of his song – Deuteronomy 31:1–30
 - The Song of Moses – Deuteronomy 32:1–43
 - Moses presented Joshua to the people as his successor – Deuteronomy 32:44–47
 - Moses to die on Mount Nebo per the LORD’s instruction – Deuteronomy 32:48–52
 - Moses blesses the tribes – Deuteronomy 33:1–29
- * **The death of Moses – Deuteronomy 34:1–12**
 - Moses climbed Mount Nebo and the LORD showed him the Promised Land – Deuteronomy 34:1–4
 - Moses died in Moab and the LORD buried him – Deuteronomy 34:5–12:
 - Moses was 120 years old and no one knows where his grave is – Deuteronomy 34:6–7
 - The Israelites grieved for 30 days – Deuteronomy 34:8
 - Joshua filled with the spirit of wisdom succeeded Moses – Deuteronomy 34:9
 - No prophet has risen in Israel like Moses – Deuteronomy 34:10–12
