RUTH 1 Back to Bethlehem Outline

Bethlehem Background (vs 1-2)

- * A famine in the days of the judges (vs 1) -
 - Elimelech and Naomi were from Bethlehem in Judah
 - Because of the famine they went with their two sons to live in Moab for a while
- * Their two sons were named Mahlon and Kilion (vs 2)

Tragedy Strikes the Family in Moab (vs 3-5)

- * Elimelech died and left Naomi with their two sons (vs 3)
- * The sons married Moabite women, named Orpah and Ruth (vs 4)
- * After ten years living in Moab the two sons, Mahlon and Kilion died (vs 4-5)
- * Naomi was left without her two sons and husband (vs 5)

The LORD Breaks the Famine in the Land of Judah (vs 6-15)

- * Word arrives in Moab and Naomi and her daughters-in-law prepare and set out on the road to the land of Judah (vs 6-7)
- * Naomi tells Orpah and Ruth to return to Moab to find another husband (vs 8-13) -
 - Naomi tells them she is too old to have another husband (vs 12)
 - Even if there was her sons it would be too long for Orpah and Ruth to wait for the sons to grow up (vs 12-13)
 - Naomi tells them it is <u>more bitter</u> for her than them because the LORD's hand has gone out against her (vs 13)
 - Orpah returns to Moab but Ruth clings to Naomi despite Naomi's plea (vs 14-15)

Ruth's Proclamation of Undying Love and Loyalty for Naomi (vs 16-18)

- * Where you go I will go, and where you stay I will stay (vs 16)
- * Your people will be my people and your God my God (vs 16)
- * Where you die I will die, and there I will be buried (vs 17)
- * May the LORD deal with me, if anything but death separates us (vs 17)
- * Naomi knew Ruth was determined (vs 18)

The Journey Back to Bethlehem is Completed (vs 19-22)

- * Naomi was welcomed back by a question, "Can this be Naomi?" (vs 19)
- * Naomi said to call her Mara because the Almighty has made her life bitter (vs 20)
- * Naomi laments her misfortune from the LORD (vs 21)
- * Naomi and Ruth's arrival in Bethlehem was at the beginning of the barley harvest (Feast of Firstfruits) (vs 22)

RUTH 2 Provision at Pentecost Outline

God Prepares the Way (vs 1-3)

- * Boaz introduced (vs 1)
- * Ruth goes out to glean in Boaz's field (vs 2-3)

Boaz Arrives (vs 4-16)

- * Boaz greets harvesters (vs 4)
- * Boaz notices Ruth (vs 5-7)
- * Boaz favors Ruth (vs 8, 10, 13)
- * Boaz protects and provides for Ruth (vs 9, 14-16)
- * Boaz honors Ruth (vs 11)
- * Boaz blesses Ruth (vs 12)

Ruth Receives and Shares (vs 17-19)

- * Ruth gleans and threshes (vs 17)
- * Ruth shares with Naomi (vs 18)
- * Naomi questions (vs 19)

Naomi's Awakening Hope (vs 20-23)

- * Boaz identified as a kinsman-redeemer (vs 20)
- * Ruth shares about Boaz providing (vs 21)
- * Naomi instructs Ruth (vs 22)
- * The Feast of Weeks (Pentecost) (vs 23)

RUTH 3 Together at the Threshing Floor Outline

Naomi's Tips for Ruth (vs 1-4)

- * Should I not try to find a home for you? (vs 1)
- * Is not Boaz a kinsman of ours? (vs 2)
- * Tonight's the night (vs 2-4) -
 - He will be winnowing on the threshing floor (vs 2)
 - Prepare yourself to meet him there wash, perfume & dress (vs 3)
 - Wait for the right moment (vs 3)
 - Lie down at his feet and wait for his response (vs 4)

Ruth Listens and Obeys Naomi (vs 5-6)

- * She agrees to do whatever she was told (vs 5)
- * She went down to the threshing floor (vs 6)

Ruth's Encounter with Boaz – Oh What a Night! (vs 7-15)

- * After eating, Boaz went to lie down (vs 7)
- * Ruth uncovered his feet and laid down (vs 7)
- * In the middle of the night Boaz discovers her at his feet (vs 8)
- * Ruth asks him to cover her with his garment as a kinsman-redeemer (vs9)
- * Boaz blesses her for her request (vs 10-11)
- * Boaz lets her know of a kinsman-redeemer that is nearer in order to her than he is (vs 12)
- * In the morning he will settle the matter (vs 13)
- * Ruth lay at his feet until morning and Boaz was discreet (vs 14)
- * Boaz provided Ruth with grain from the threshing floor (vs 15)

Ruth Returns to Naomi after a Night on the Threshing Floor (vs 16-18)

- * Naomi asks Ruth, how did it go? (vs 16)
- * Ruth told her everything (vs 16-17)
- * Naomi advises Ruth to wait until the matter is finished today (vs 18)

RUTH 4 Redeemed by the Redeemer Outline

Boaz Deals with the Mystery Kinsman (vs 1-8)

- * Boaz went to the city gate to confront the unknown kinsman (vs 1)
- * Boaz gathered ten city elders to sit as a court (vs 2)
- * Boaz presented the choice to the unknown kinsman (vs 3-5)-
 - To buy Elimelech's land from Naomi (vs 3)
 - The unknown kinsman has first rights before Boaz (vs 4)
 - The unknown kinsman says he will redeem it (vs 4)
 - -With the land he must acquire the dead man's widow (vs 5)
- * The unknown kinsman backs out of the deal (vs 6-8)-
 - Because it might endanger his own estate (vs 6)
 - He tells Boaz to redeem it, because he cannot (vs 6)
 - He removed his sandal to legalize the transaction (vs 7-8)


The Transaction Finalized (vs 9-12)

- * Boaz announced his intentions to the elders (vs 9-10)-
 - To buy the property of Elimelech, Kilion and Mahlon (vs 9)
 - To marry Ruth in order to maintain the name of the dead on the property (vs 10)
- * The elders as witnesses pronounce their blessing (vs 11-12)-
 - May Ruth be like Rachel and Leah building up the house of Israel (vs 11)
 - Through Ruth may your family be like Perez whom Tamar bore to Judah (vs 12)

The Genealogy from Perez to David (vs 13-22)

- * Ruth became Boaz's wife (vs 13)
- * The LORD enabled Ruth to conceive and she gave birth to a son (vs 13)
- * Naomi has a kinsman-redeemer (vs14-15)-
 - Praise be to the LORD (vs 14)
 - He will renew her life and sustain her in her old age (vs 15)
 - For her the love of Ruth is better than seven sons (vs 15)
- * Naomi took the child and cared for him (vs 16)
- * Naomi has a son, named Obed (vs 17)
- * Obed was the father of Jesse, who was the father of David (vs 17)
- * The family line of Perez defined using ten names (vs 18-22)
