2 Samuel Outline:

*** David's rise to the throne – 2 Samuel 1:1–4:12**

- David hears of Saul's and Jonathan's deaths – 2 Samuel 1:1–16
- David's lament for Saul and Jonathan – 2 Samuel 1:17–27
- David anointed king over Judah – 2 Samuel 2:1–7
- War breaks out between the houses of David and Saul – 2 Samuel 2:8–3:5
 - The house of Saul led by Abner, the commander of Saul's army, made Saul's son, Ish-Bosheth, king over Israel – 2 Samuel 2:8–10a
 - The house of Judah followed David as king in Hebron with Joab as their commander – 2 Samuel 2:10b–11,13a
 - Abner's forces met Joab's forces at Gibeon – 2 Samuel 2:12,13b–16
 - The battle between forces was fierce and the war between the house of Saul and the house of David lasted a long time – 2 Samuel 2:17–3:5
- Abner, Saul's commander defects to David – 2 Samuel 3:6–21
- Joab murders Abner – 2 Samuel 3:22–39
 - David did not know that Joab avenged the death of his brother Asahel by killing Abner – 2 Samuel 3:22–27
 - When David found out he cursed Joab's house and led a lament and wept over the death of Abner – 2 Samuel 3:28–39
- Ish-Bosheth murdered – 2 Samuel 4:1–12
 - Jonathan had a crippled son named Mephibosheth – 2 Samuel 4:4
 - David's vengeance on the killers of Saul's son, Ish-Bosheth – 2 Samuel 4:1–3,5–12

*** David's accomplishments as king – 2 Samuel 5:1–9:13**

- David becomes king over Israel – 2 Samuel 5:1–5
- David conquers Jerusalem, the fortress of Zion, as the City of David – 2 Samuel 5:6–16
- David defeats the Philistines – 2 Samuel 5:17–25
- The ark is brought to Jerusalem – 2 Samuel 6:1–15
- David and Michal – 2 Samuel 6:16–23
- God's promise to David (the Davidic Covenant) – 2 Samuel 7:1–17
- David's prayer – 2 Samuel 7:18–29
- David's victories – 2 Samuel 8:1–14
- David's officials – 2 Samuel 8:15–18
- David and Mephibosheth – 2 Samuel 9:1–13

*** David's weaknesses and failures – 2 Samuel 10:1–20:26**

- David defeats the Ammonites – 2 Samuel 10:1–19
- David and Bathsheba – 2 Samuel 11:1–27
- Nathan rebukes David (“You are the man”) – 2 Samuel 12:1–31
- Amnon and Tamar – 2 Samuel 13:1–22
- Absalom kills Amnon – 2 Samuel 13:23–33
- Absalom flees to Geshur – 2 Samuel 13:34–39
- Absalom returns to Jerusalem – 2 Samuel 14:1–33
- Abalom's conspiracy – 2 Samuel 15:1–12
- David flees – 2 Samuel 15:13–37
- David and Ziba – 2 Samuel 16:1–4
- Shimel curses David – 2 Samuel 16:5–14
- Absalom enters Jerusalem – 2 Samuel 16:15
- The advice of Hushai and Ahithophel – 2 Samuel 16:16–17:23
- David went to Mahanaim and Absalom crossed the Jordan – 2 Samuel 17:24–29
- Absalom killed – 2 Samuel 18:1–18
- David hears of Absalom's death and mourns – 2 Samuel 18:19–33
- Joab rebukes David – 2 Samuel 19:1–8
- David returns to Jerusalem and pardons his enemies – 2 Samuel 19:9–43
- Sheba rebels against David – 2 Samuel 20:1–26

*** Final reflections about David's reign – 2 Samuel 21:1–24:25**

- David avenged the Gibeonites – 2 Samuel 21:1–14
- Wars against the Philistines – 2 Samuel 21:15–22
 - Abishai came to David's rescue and struck down Ishbi-Benob, a descendant of Rapha – 2 Samuel 21:15–17
 - At Gob, Sibbecai killed Saph, a descendant of Rapha – 2 Samuel 21:18
 - At Gob, Elhanan killed Goliath the Gittite – 2 Samuel 21:19
 - At Gath, Jonathan, son of David's brother, Shimeah, killed a huge man who was a descendant of Rapha – 2 Samuel 21:20–21
 - These four descendants of Rapha in Gath fell at the hands of David and his men – 2 Samuel 21:22
- David's song of praise and deliverance – 2 Samuel 22:1–51
- The last words of David – 2 Samuel 23:1–7
- David's mighty men – 2 Samuel 23:8–39
- David has Joab count the fighting men (his census) -2 Samuel 24:1–9
- The LORD's judgment of David's sin – 2 Samuel 24:10–17
- David builds an altar – 2 Samuel 24:18–25
