2 Kings Outline:

*** The ministries of Elijah and Elisha – 2 Kings 1:1–8:15**

- The LORD's judgment on Ahaziah, king of Israel – 2 Kings 1:1–18

Ahaziah was injured and tried to consult with Baal-Zebub, as to his fate – 2 Kings 1:2
The angel of the LORD intervened and sent Elijah to pronounce Ahaziah's fate, sending fire from heaven twice telling Ahaziah that he will die and he did – 2 Kings 1:3–16
Ahaziah had no son so Joram, Ahaziah's younger brother succeeded him – 2 Kings 1:17

- Elijah was taken to heaven alive – 2 Kings 2:1–18

The LORD was about to take Elijah up to heaven in a whirlwind – 2 Kings 2:1
Elijah & Elisha went from Gilgal to Bethel to Jericho to the Jordan River – 2 Kings 2:1–7
Elijah struck Jordan's water with his cloak, they walked over on dry ground – 2 Kings 2:8
Elisha asked Elijah for a double portion of Elijah's spirit and he received it as he saw Elijah go up to heaven in a whirlwind with a chariot and horses of fire – 2 Kings 2:9–12
Elisha picked up Elijah's cloak striking the water, crossing back over – 2 Kings 2:13–14
50 prophets of Jericho searched for Elijah three days not finding him – 2 Kings 2:15–18

- Elisha's ministry begins – 2 Kings 2:19–25

The LORD healed the water of Jericho so the land became productive – 2 Kings 2:19–22
In Bethel Elisha was jeered by some youth as a baldhead so he called down a curse on them in the LORD's name and 42 were mauled by two bears – 2 Kings 2:23–24
From there Elisha went on to Mount Carmel – 2 Kings 2:25

- When Joram was king of Israel, Mesha, king of Moab, rebelled – 2 Kings 3:1–27

Joram did evil in the eyes of the LORD – 2 Kings 3:1–3
As Moab rebelled, Israel, Judah and Edom mobilized against Moab – 2 Kings 3:4–9
As the kings of Israel, Judah and Edom failed they sought Elisha's help – 2 Kings 3:10–14
The hand of the LORD provided water to bring victory against Moab – 2 Kings 3:15–25

- Moab's king offered his firstborn son as a sacrifice on the city wall – 2 Kings 3:26–27

- The widow's oil – 2 Kings 4:1–7

- Raising from the dead the Shunammite's son – 2 Kings 4:8–37

- Death in the pot to feeding the people by the word of the LORD, demonstrating God's covenant grace – 2 Kings 4:38–44

- Naaman was healed of leprosy – 2 Kings 5:1–27

- Elisha recovered an iron axhead in the Jordan getting it to float – 2 Kings 6:1–7

- Elisha's prayers/advice helped Israel bring peace with Aram – 2 Kings 6:8–23

- Later Ben-Hadad, king of Aram, laid siege to Samaria bringing famine but Elisha shared the word of the LORD and the siege would be lifted – 2 Kings 6:24–7:2

- The siege lifted – 2 Kings 7:3–20

- The Shunammite's land restored – 2 Kings 8:1–6

- Hazael murders Ben-Hadad – 2 Kings 8:7–15

*** Israel's decline and exile – 2 Kings 8:16–17:41**

- Jehoram King of Judah – 2 Kings 8:16–24

- Ahaziah king of Judah – 2 Kings 8:25–29
- Jehu king of Israel – 2 Kings 9:1–13
- Jehu kills Joram and Ahaziah – 2 Kings 9:14–29
- Jezebel killed – 2 Kings 9:30–37
- Ahab's family killed – 2 Kings 10:1–17
